Attendance: Each student is allowed 2 "free" absences during the semester. Being more than ten minutes late is considered half an absence. Each subsequent absence will result in a deduction of 1 point from your semester score. More than 4 absences, the 2 free absences included, will lower your semester grade by one full grade. Seven absences, the 2 free absences included, will result in an F.

Homework: There are two types of homework in this class: listening comprehension in monologue style (you are required to write down what you hear in Chinese) and listening homework for oral activities (you can answer all the questions in English with the permission of the instructor). The due date is always the same day the homework is printed in your course syllabus. Please go to the blackboard to listen to the recordings of the text, and to download the answer sheet for listening homework for oral activities.

All the homework in monologue style must be hand-written, and both homework must be turned in at the beginning of class. Homework turned in late will result in a 10-point deduction from the homework grade. Homework will not be accepted once the correct answer is posted on the Blackboard, which is the next day. One lowest score on each category will be dropped at the end of the semester.

Oral Tests: You will be tested on all the oral activities you have practiced in class followed by a feedback session the next week. Oral activities in role play style will be administered on Wednesday and Friday and **during office hours**; activities in monologue style will be administered on Monday.

Only 1 make-up test is allowed if a legitimate reason is given one week ahead of the test time. Otherwise, students will receive a zero on that particular test.

Speech Presentation: You must be present in all the presentation days to receive a grade in this category. For more details, please refer to Speech Guideline at p.10.

Vocabulary Quizzes: At the beginning of each W&F class period, a 5-minute vocabulary quiz will be given at the beginning of class. Each quiz covers vocabulary from the lessons printed in the course syllabus for that class day from Talk Mandarin Today. You are required to recognize the characters in both versions in order to write down the correct pinyin and tones along with its English translation. Please download the vocabulary list on our blackboard for the traditional version of the characters. You can drop 2 quizzes. No make-up quiz is allowed.

Oral Presentation: there are two types of oral presentations in this class: presentation on the monologues for listening homework and presentations on the oral activities practiced on Wednesday and Friday in class. Both are designed to reinforce students' ability to engage in daily life conversations with ease and confidence.

Every Monday, students will be required to present the oral activities they have practiced in class during the previous week with their partner.

Every Wednesday and Friday, 3-5 students will be randomly drawn to orally present the monologue homework they have done in the previous week. You have to memorize the monologue to receive a grade although you can bring flash card (the English translation) during the time you present. At the end of the semester, one lowest score will be dropped if you have received more than three scores in this category.

Reading Quizzes: There are two types of reading quizzes in this class:

Quizzes conducted on regular class days: students will be quizzed on Wed. and Fri. in class right after the 5-minute vocabulary quiz. The reading covers the lessons printed in the course syllabus for that class day. You will be quizzed on the character version that **you write**.

Quizzes conducted on reading quiz days: Readings are randomly drawn on the quiz day from all the dialogues printed in our course packet. Both versions of the Chinese characters will be tested.

Quiz1 - 2/11 L.1-10

Quiz2 - 3/25 L.11-20

Quiz3 - 4/22 L. 21-30

Preparation & Progress: Preparation for all the oral activities in class is mandatory. A language exchange partner is recommended to help you better prepare the task beforehand. At the end of the semester, a grade will be assigned based on the preparation and over-all progress a student has made in the class.

Language pledge: No English is allowed in class (in order to maximize the usage and exposure of Chinese language). One point will be deducted each time the rule is violated. More than 10 times, the student will receive a zero in this category.
