**Additional Natural Science (Liberal Arts)**

Three additional semester hours in natural science selected from Astronomy, Biology, Chemistry, Geology, Marine Science, Nutrition, Physical Science, Physics, Mathematics, Computer Science, Statistics and Scientific Computation or approved list of alternatives. Courses from the Science and Technology, Part I and Part II lists may also be used.

**NOTE:** Only nine hours in a single field may be used for math and science requirements. Only three hours of history or philosophy of science may be used.
