Additional Natural Science (Liberal Arts) – 18 hours math & science required

Three hours chosen from PHL 313Q or TC 310 or approved substitute.

Three additional semester hours in natural science selected from Astronomy, Biology, Chemistry, Geological Sciences, Marine Science, Nutrition, Physical Science, Physics, Mathematics, Computer Science, Statistics and Data Services or approved list of alternatives. Courses from the Natural Science and Technology, Part I and Part II lists may also be used.

NOTE: Only nine hours in a single field may be used for math and science requirements.
