Foreign Language (Liberal Arts)

Intermediate Proficiency in a single foreign language sequence is required. Proficiency is reached when the last course in the sequence is successfully completed. Sequences can be two, three or four courses in length depending on the language, for additional information visit:

American & Texas Government (Core)

Six semester hours chosen from the following combinations:

Government:

- GOV 310L and GOV 312L or GOV 312P
- GOV 310L and GOV 3US or GOV 3TX
- GOV 3US and GOV 3TX

NOTE: GOV 3US and GOV 3TX are both transfer classes.

US History (Core)

Six hours chosen from:

History: HIS 314K, 315G, 315K, 315L, 317L, 320L, 320P, 320R, 333L, 333M, 334L, 340S, 345J, 345L, 350R, 351P, 355F, 355M, 355N, 355P, 355S, 356G, 356K, 356P, 356S, 356R, 357C, 357D, 365G, 376F

Mathematics (Core / Liberal Arts / Plan II)

Three semester hours chosen from **M 310P Plan II Math** or approved substitute.

Science & Technology, Part I (Core)

Six hours in a single field of study chosen from the following disciplines: Astronomy, Biology, Chemistry, Geological Sciences, Marine Science, Physics/Physical Science.

Note: All Plan II students must take BIO 310E (Plan II Biology) and PHY 321 (Plan II Physics), or an acceptable substitute to fulfill Plan II requirements.

Recommended sequences for six hours in the same subject:

- **BIO 301E and 301D (typically offered only in fall), 301G, 305F, 309D, 309F**
 - **BIO 311C and BIO 311D**
 - **BIO 315H and BIO 325H**
- AP Biology credit may apply

Note: Students may use credit by exam in Chemistry, Physics or Geological Sciences to fulfill the UT Core Science & Technology requirements. Science & Technology, Part II (Core)

Three semester hours chosen from the list below **or from the Part I list**. The course must be in a field of study different from field used for Part I.

- Anthropology:** ANT 301, 304, 304T
Computer Science: C S 302, 303E, 312
Electrical and Computer Engineering: EE 302
Geography: GRG 301C, 301K, 304E
Nutrition: NTR 306

NOTE: Plan II students using Plan II Biology for Science & Technology, Part I may apply Plan II Physics (PHY 321) for Part II (and vice versa).

Additional Natural Science (Liberal Arts) – 18 hours math & science required

- Three hours chosen from PHL 313Q Plan II Logic or TC 310 Plan II Modes of Reasoning or approved substitute.
- Three additional semester hours in Natural Science. Any from the Natural Science, Part I and Part II lists may be used. In addition, students may select a course from the approved Liberal Arts Natural Science List found here:

PHY 321 Plan II Physics: may substitute with:

- an approved alternative course offered by Plan II
- two upper-division PHY courses (excludes PHY 370C, 371C, and 341)
- two upper-division CH courses (excludes CH 320M/ 328M, 320N/328N, 220C, 128K, 128L, 341, 644, 144K, 144L, 368, 369K, 371K, 372C, 375K/475K)
- two upper division BCH courses (excludes BCH 369K)
