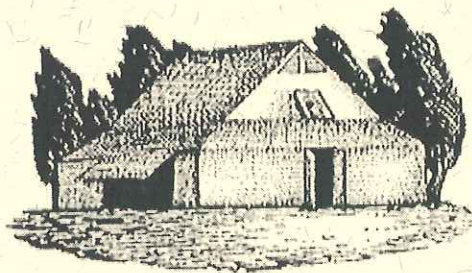

Shakespeare at Winedale has grown from a Fall semester class in 1970 (with eleven students) into a multi-faceted educational program with venues at UT Austin, Winedale, and London. Please have a look at the summer schedule for *Macbeth*, *The Tempest*, and *The Merry Wives of Windsor* on the back leaf and make your reservations early! Our Educational Outreach to Schools Program is growing: we've directed Winedale weekend workshops for several schools (Austin, Victoria, Houston) during the year and are now busy planning our third residential session of Camp Shakespeare, for young people, ages 9-13. In addition, we are offering a third summer "UTeach Shakespeare through Performance" class, offered to both prospective and experienced teachers. This summer the course will be taught by Susan Todd, a former Shakespeare at Winedale student and Professor Loehlin's assistant director. The 15th annual performance of the 15th Century *Secunda Pastorum*, performed by schoolchildren, on the first Saturday in December, rounds out the year.

The Spring '04 Shakespeare at Winedale class and I would like to thank Eunice Roberts, actor, teacher, director, from London, England, for assisting with the development of our play, for helping us find our places in it, but especially for sharing, from the actor's point of view, her approach to Shakespeare's words and characters. We also wish to thank former students of Shakespeare at Winedale as well as James Loehlin, director, and Clay Maer, coordinator, for their "behind the scenes" support. There is much virtue in this play and there is much virtue in this class. And much virtue in IF. We hope you like the play. Thanks for coming.

We strongly urge you to make reservations for the plays this summer, particularly on Saturday afternoons and evenings. Tickets are \$8 (please see the exceptions below). For reservations, call the Winedale Historical Center, (979) 278-3530 (9-5 daily) or write to them at P.O. Box 11, Round Top, TX 78954. We do not confirm reservations for groups over 10 unless payment is made in advance. If wheelchair accessibility is necessary, please specify when making reservations. Tickets are not mailed, but are available at the theatre 1 1/2 hours prior to each performance. Insofar as possible, preferential reserved seating will be given to contributors to this year's program; other seats are available on a first-come first-served basis. Reserved seats must be occupied 10 minutes prior to the performance. Our traditional stew dinner with all the trimmings (\$5) will be served at 5 P.M. before the Saturday, July 24th and Saturday, July 31st performances.

Saturday, July 17th, our "Midsummer Night at Winedale" Gala fundraiser will help us meet our NEH Challenge. Enjoy a dinner, a silent auction and a preview of the summer's plays, \$125. Please call 512-471-4726 for reservations. *Sunday, July 25th, our 2 PM performance will be signed for the deaf. **Thursday, July 29th, tickets for all Fayette County residents are \$4. *** On Saturday, August 8, for our season finale, we will have a cocktail reception at 6 p.m. in the Meadows classroom with a champagne toast after the 7:30 performance. Tickets for this event are \$20.
