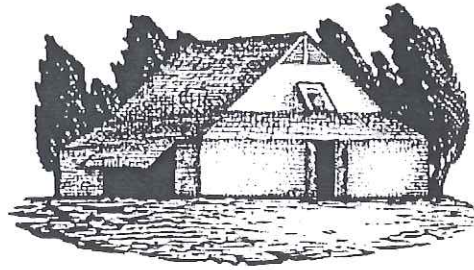

Tickets are not mailed, but are available at the theatre 1 1/2 hours prior to each performance. Insofar as possible, preferential reserved seating will be given to contributors to this year's program; other seats are available on a first-come first-served basis. Reserved seats must be occupied 10 minutes prior to the performance.
